

C-3.1 Admission policy and procedure

1. Purpose

To establish the principles and requirements that inform the Admission practices to the AVA Chartered Veterinary Practitioner Accreditation Program.

2. Scope

This policy applies to the process by which Applicants apply for Admission to the AVA CVP Accreditation Program. The Admission process finishes when the Applicants is formally enrolled as a AVA CVP Student.

3. Policy Statement

The AVA establishes the expectations and requirements for Admission to the AVA CVP Accreditation Program through this policy and procedure. Admission is determined based on specific program requirements and perceived ability to complete the program.

4. Principles

- 4.1 The admission principles to the AVA CVP Accreditation Program are:
 - 4.1.1 Admission to the AVA CVP Accreditation Program is determined on specific requirements, and perceived probability of success of an Applicant.
 - 4.1.2 The AVA supports the Admission of Applicants who are considered to have a reasonable chance of success in the Accreditation Program to which they apply.
 - 4.1.3 There are a limited number of places available within the AVA CVP Accreditation Program. Where demand for the AVA CVP Accreditation Program exceeds the available number of places, Admission to the AVA CVP Accreditation Program may be offered for a future admission period or may be denied, despite the Applicant meeting the entry requirements.
 - 4.1.4 Admission requirements will be made available for Applicants within the entry requirements published on the AVA website.

5. Procedures

5.1 Application for admission

Applicants must apply using the method and by the due date advised by the AVA for each admission intake.

5.2 Admission requirements

Applicants are considered against the entry requirements for the AVA CVP Accreditation Program, including:

- Current financial membership of the Australian Veterinary Association;
- Current financial membership of the discipline specific Special Interest Group of the AVA in which the AVA CVP Accreditation Program is offered;
- right to practice veterinary science within Australia;
- English language proficiency;
- ability to satisfy any additional entry requirements.

Specific entry requirements are published on the AVA Chartered Veterinary Practitioner website.

5.2.1 English language proficiency

All Applicants must meet the minimum English language proficiency requirement specified for the Accreditation Program. Unless otherwise specified, English language proficiency may be demonstrated by an applicant through one or more of the following:

- an IELTS academic test conducted no more than two years prior to the date of application (Note: AVA may determine equivalent scores on other approved English tests).
- satisfactory completion of secondary schooling in Australia.
- one year of successful full-time (or equivalent) accredited diploma level studies or higher in Australia.
- successful completion of a recognised English bridging program.
- successful completion of studies equivalent to secondary school or higher outside
 Australia where the medium of instruction is English and recognised by the AVA.

5.3 Offer of admission

- 5.3.1 Where demand exceeds the number of available places in the AVA CVP

 Accreditation Program, not all eligible Applicants who satisfy the entry requirements may by be offered a place within the period for which application is sought.
- 5.3.2 Where an Applicant meets a specified entry threshold an offer of Admission may be extended to the AVA CVP Accreditation Program.
- 5.3.3 Offers of admission specify the discipline specialisation for which the offer is made. Admitted Applicants are required to enrol in accordance with the offer of admission and complete at least the first Study Period, unless otherwise specified by AVA CVP Academic Program Director (or nominee).
- 5.3.4 An offer of admission may be conditional upon the Applicant satisfying requirements specified within the offer.
- 5.3.5 An Applicant offered admission is required to satisfy all offer conditions and enrol for the Study Period specified in the offer of admission by the required date in

accordance with *C-3.2 Enrolment policy and procedure*. Failure to enrol or meet offer conditions will result in the offer of admission being withdrawn, unless Deferment is approved (refer *Section 5.4 Deferment* below).

5.4 Deferment

- 5.4.1 Applicants offered admission to the AVA CVP Accreditation Program may apply to defer commencement of their study.
- 5.4.2 Applicants may defer commencement in the offered program of study for up to two calendar years.
- 5.4.3 If a Deferment is approved, Applicants will be subject to the AVA CVP Accreditation Program rules and fee structures in operation at the time of their new commencement.

5.5 International Students

The AVA Chartered Veterinary Practitioner Accreditation Program is not currently CRICOS registered and is therefore not available for international students to study on-campus in Australia. Students who meet the entry requirements and are practicing outside of Australia may apply for admission.

5.6 Return to study

- 5.6.1 AVA CVP Students who wish to re-enter the AVA CVP Accreditation Program after a period of absence and who are not returning from Leave of Absence or Deferment must reapply for admission. AVA CVP Students returning to study will be considered for the current version of the AVA CVP Accreditation Program and may be required to satisfy all entry requirements, including any additional entry requirements in operation at the time of their return, together with any new offer conditions.
- 5.6.2 An AVA CVP Student returning to study will not necessarily retain Credit for all Courses or approved CPD Requirements for Accreditation completed prior to the absence. Credit for Courses or approved CPD Requirements for Accreditation will be determined taking into consideration the length of the absence and changes to AVA CVP Accreditation Program content and structure during the intervening period. The AVA CVP Student may be required to repeat Courses that have been passed previously or to undertake additional Courses or CPD Requirements for Accreditation in order to satisfy the current AVA CVP Accreditation Program requirements.

5.7 Suspension or exclusion

- 5.7.1 The AVA may refuse admission to Applicants to the AVA CVP Accreditation Program who have been suspended from a higher education institution for non-academic reasons (discipline or misconduct) whilst the suspension or equivalent action remains in force.
- 5.7.2 In line with *C-3.3 Academic progress policy and procedure*, AVA CVP Students who have been excluded from the AVA CVP Accreditation Program as a result of unsatisfactory academic performance or whose Enrolment has been suspended as a

result of proven student general misconduct will not be considered for Admission to an AVA program of study unless:

- At least 12 months have elapsed from the date of Exclusion or suspension; and
- The application is accompanied by a written statement to be reviewed as part of the Admission decision. The statement should address factors such as changed circumstances, maturity and motivation, academic and/or vocational performance since exclusion or suspension.
- 5.7.3 The readmission of an AVA CVP Student to the AVA CVP Accreditation Program from which they have been excluded as a result of unsatisfactory academic performance or suspended as a result of proven student general misconduct is also subject to:
 - a place being available; and
 - the recommendation of the AVA CVP Academic Program Director to the AVA CVP Learning and Teaching Committee as to whether the student should be readmitted.

5.8 Appeals

Applicants who are dissatisfied with the outcome of their Admission application may seek a review by the AVA in line with *C-8.2 Student appeals procedure*. The review must be sought within 10 AVA Business Days of the date of the notification of the admission outcome. A written notification of the review Decision will be provided, usually within 15 AVA Business Days.

	 currently enrolled in one or more Courses; or not currently enrolled but is on approved leave of Absence or whose Admission has not been cancelled.

Course

A discrete element of a program, normally undertaken over a single Study Period, in which the AVA CVP Student enrols and on completion of which the AVA CVP Student is awarded a Grade.

CPD Requirements for Accreditation

The combination and extent of training (or CPD) recognised by the AVA as contributing to the Accreditation Program.

Credit

Credit may be granted towards Courses in the AVA CVP Accreditation Program based on recognition of prior studies.

CRICOS

Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students.

Deferment

Approval granted to AVA CVP Students who have accepted an offer of Admission to the Accreditation Program for the first time to delay the commencement of Enrolment for up to two calendar years.

Enrolment

The process of admitting AVA CVP Students to one or more Courses for the current Academic Year.

Exclusion

Prohibition from enrolling in the Accreditation Program or a Course for a specified period.

IELTS

The International English Language Testing System (IELTS) is an English language test for study, migration or work.

Leave of Absence

An approval granted to an AVA CVP Student to cease formal study as an enrolled AVA CVP Student for a specified period of time.

Study Period

The period during which a Course is offered, instruction is provided, learning is undertaken and Assessment is carried out.
